# Harmonisation of LCA



# Starting point

## Question:

Are Environmental Declarations of Products and Organisations the way to Harmonise LCAs?

## Position FOEN:

From our perspective they are not the way to harmonise LCA, because

- they are an application of LCA for specific (policy) objectives
- the restrictions which have to be defined in programmes and PCRs might not be useful for other objectives or decision situations.

But Environmental Declarations of Products require a harmonisation at a specific level focused on the objective.



# FOEN participation in LCA harmonisation

## Requirement:

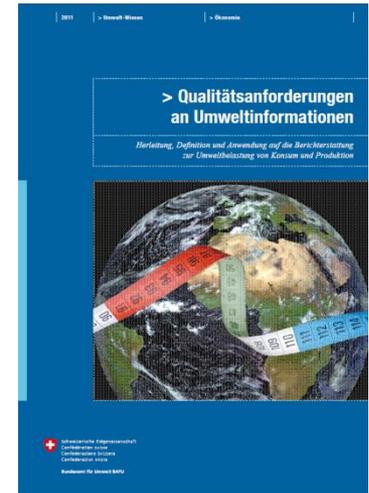
Harmonisation initiative should fulfil the “true and fair view” criteria

## Participation/Contribution:

UNEP/SETAC Life cycle initiative

Intergovernmental Dialogue on Quality data availability for policy making

*Single market for green products pilot phase*

# Policy needs: Databases

- Needs
  - accepted generic LCI (relevant, reliable, consistent and transparent)
  - quality requirements for product specific LCI
- Possible harmonisation
  - consistent terminology
  - data documentation
- Frame for the Harmonisation
  - UNEP/SETAC Life Cycle Initiative



# Policy needs: LC approaches

- Needs
  - Adaptable approaches which could be used in different decision situations
  - International standards with a high flexibility
- Potential contribution to harmonisation
  - Limited as consensus has priority
  - Consideration of stakeholder needs in revisions
- Frame for the Harmonisation
  - International Organization for Standardization



# Policy needs: LCIA

- Needs
  - A set of recommended environmental impact category indicators would be highly appreciated
  - Normalisation and weighting should also be addressed
- Frame for the Harmonisation
  - UNEP/SETAC Life Cycle Initiative
  - ILCD recommendation as useful first step (weighting missing)



# Policy needs: Specific programmes and activities

- Needs
  - appropriate LC approaches for specific policy objectives
  - harmonisation which allows to achieve the objective
- Needs (Environmental Information on Products)
  - consistent Product and Sector Category Rules,
  - reliable data
- Possible harmonisation
  - Depends the objective/activity and on national policies
- Frame for the Harmonisation
  - multi- or international initiatives



# Environmental Declaration of Products



# Actual state

- no or incomplete environmental information for many products
- products causing high environmental burdens can not be identify
- Risk of „Greenwashing“
- Consumers express a need for clear and reliable environmental information
- Consumers are willing to pay more for environmentally friendly products, if they are convinced





# Political mandate: Green Economy Action Plan



- Federal Council adopted the action plan with 27 measures on the March 8, 2013
- Improving resource efficiency of **consumption and production** one of the 4 core areas
  - Measure 4: Improvement of environmental information on products
  - Measure 5: Environmental information on product ranges
  - Measure 8: Voluntary agreements with the economy concerning products



# Participation in the SMGP Pilot Phase



## Why does FOEN participate in the EU SMGP Pilot Phase:

- Too many initiatives might foil the aim of Environmental Information on Products.
- Same goal: Increase market transparency with comprehensive and reliable information on the environmental performance of products
- Same principles: transparency, reliability, completeness, comparability, etc.



# Participation in the SMGP Pilot Phase



## How is FOEN involved in the EU SMGP Pilot Phase:

- Technical secretariat member in 4 Pilots:
  - With financial contribution: T-Shirt, Coffee
  - Without financial contribution: Household detergents, Non-leather shoes
- Member of the Steering Committee
- Member in the Technical Advisory Board



# Participation in the SMGP Pilot Phase



## Harmonisation within the SMGP pilot phase:

- although the PEF-Method is very detailed it leaves room for decisions and interpretation
- large diversity of approaches in the different Pilots
- further alignment needed
  - allocation (e.g. WG Cow)
  - between PEFCRs from the same sector
- Possible harmonisation at a later stage
  - benchmarking and definition of classes of environmental performance
  - background system



# Summary

## LCA Harmonisation

- FOEN supports harmonisation initiatives
- Harmonisation shall take place at several levels
- An overall harmonisation will hardly be reached because national policies may entail different LCA approaches

## Environmental Declarations of Products

- FOEN has the mandate/task to work in this field
- unilateral approaches are not effective
- SMGP pilot phase is very ambitious
- further alignment/harmonisation might be needed
